Dallas County Health & Human Services Schedules Ground Spraying

Lancaster, TX – A West Nile Virus mosquito trap, located in the 2800 block of McCormick, Lancaster 75134, has tested positive and was confirmed by Dallas County Health and Human Services. The City of Lancaster has coordinated with Dallas County Health and Human Services to conduct ground spraying for the areas in which the positive trap was located. Weather permitting, ground spraying is scheduled for Wednesday, September 7, Thursday, September 8, and Sunday, September 11, between 9:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.

Although the pesticide is approved by the Environmental Protection Agency, residents are advised to take the following precautions: Minimize exposure, remain indoors during the hours while spraying is in progress. Close windows and keep pets inside. If skin or clothes are exposed, wash them with soap and water. Rinse homegrown fruits and vegetables as a precaution. Cover small ornamental fish ponds and keep outdoor pets covered. The chemical breaks down quickly in sunlight and water, so no special precautions are suggested for outdoor swimming pools.

City of Lancaster residents are provided free mosquito dunks and insect repellent at 700 E. Main Street and 211 N. Henry Street while supplies last. The mosquito dunks assist in mosquito control by killing mosquito larvae when applied to water sources.
